INTRODUCTION

Benefit verification (BV) forms check insurance coverage prior to placing advanced wound care products. Most often, nurses are responsible for completing and submitting the form. This task can be time consuming and requires transcription of information to paper forms, faxing of multiple documents, and scanning in completed forms.


OBJECTIVES

- · Reduce scanning

CONCLUSION

An electronic benefit verification form takes less time for nursing to complete compared to paper forms and reduces scanning by 50 percent. Pulling existing information from the EMR eliminates the risk of transcription errors.
