We discuss the application of the 10 Rule Concept of Ikigai in the radiology workplace.

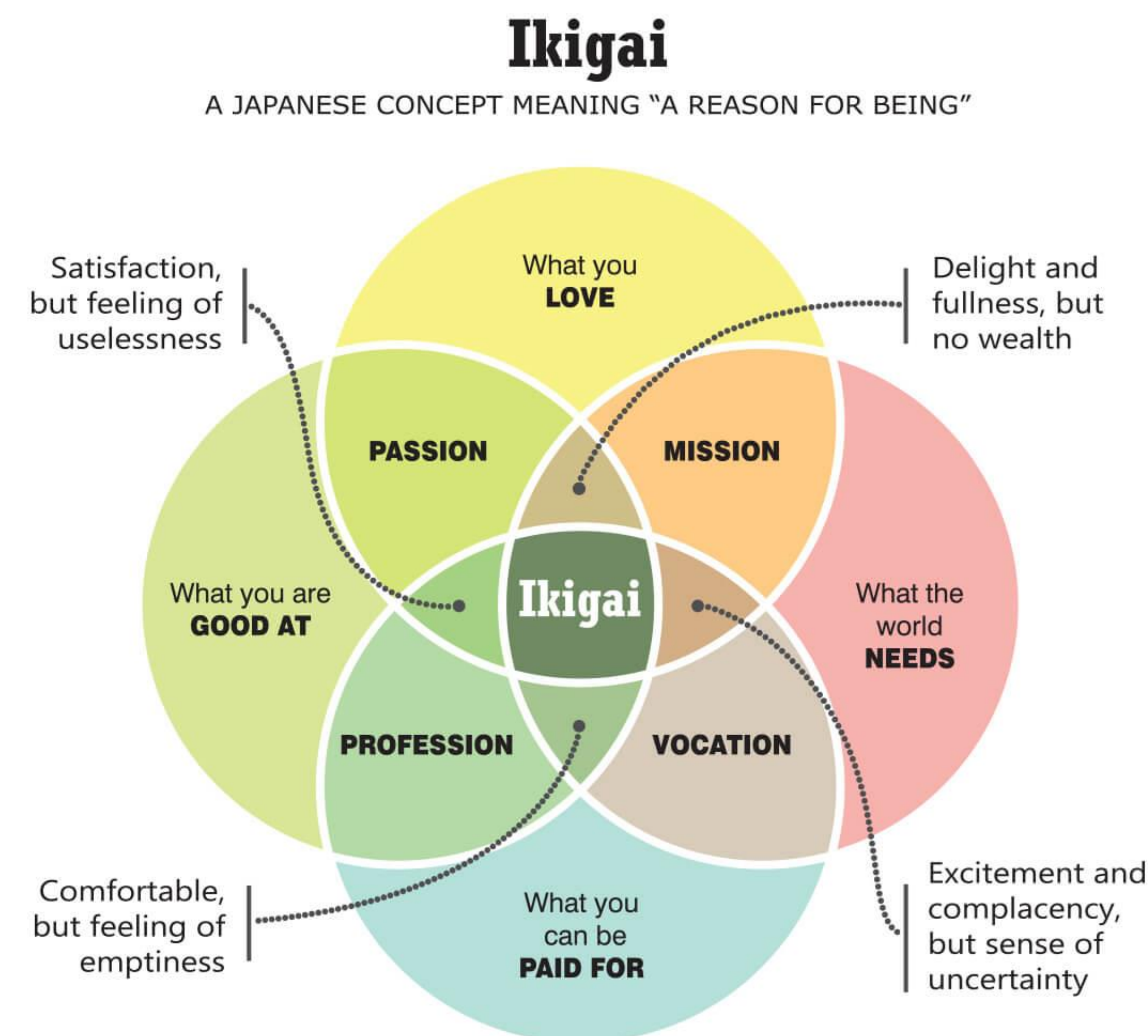
Methods/Materials
