- Pharmacy legislative success is limited by the finite number of practicing pharmacists, as well as varying pharmacy interests
- It is critical to engage student pharmacists to advocate for our profession as a team
- Pharmacy educators in Ohio created a 1-hour elective to encourage our students to advocate together collaboratively across interests and institutions

COURSE DESIGN

- Hybrid learning experience
- Utilized one LMS course page hosted by the University of Cincinnati
- Culminated in a combined visit to the Ohio Statehouse to advocate for current pharmacy issues
- Statehouse visit supported by the Ohio Pharmacists Association
- 7 online asynchronous lessons prior to the visit to the Statehouse
- Each individual campus met to prep before the Statehouse visit, as well as to debrief after the visit

Implementing a cross-college advocacy elective was a feasible high-impact learning experience that emphasized the importance of legislative advocacy, and was well received by student pharmacists.

- Enrolled 36 students from 4 Universities
