If You Build It They Will Come: A New Course for Struggling Students

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Introduction

Navigating the rigorous path of a PharmD program is a journey that not all students traverse with ease. Some struggle to keep pace with the demanding coursework and high expectations while navigating academic, emotional, and social challenges. Many resources have been developed to foster a supportive academic environment that cultivates resilience, encourages engagement, and promotes success for all students embarking on this challenging yet rewarding professional journey.





Methodology

A remediation course, "Tools to Enhance Academic Success" was created at The University of Texas at Austin College of Pharmacy in 2020 and expanded to Ferris State University in 2023 with targeted enrollment from students experiencing academic difficulty in their first semester of pharmacy school.


Course evaluation surveys and subsequent student performance throughout the curriculum were analyzed to assess impact.






Results/Findings

Though the full impact through graduation cannot be assessed due to the recent implementation, a review of student progression after completion of the course indicates that students completing the course are successful in future PharmD coursework.





Across 10 course offerings at two institutions, 125 students have successfully completed the courses.

All but 6 are still in or have graduated from the program.

Curricular Changes Made Based on Feedback from this Course

- Exam Review Process overview implemented for P1s in Administrative Sessions so all students could benefit.
- Backward navigation use during exams reconsidered by faculty.
- Item rationales were required for all assessment items in required courses.

- Study skills session was added to New Student Orientation to discuss students' overestimation of study skills.
- Faculty development sessions created on evidence-based teaching and learning strategies.

Student Feedback and Comments

- Based on a 5-point scale, students rate the course at an average score of 4.92 (range 4.8-5.0).
- Qualitative analysis of student course evaluation surveys depict the course as being enriching, beneficial, and one that students wish everyone could experience in their first year of pharmacy school.

This innovative approach has been successful in remediating students to success and has grown in popularity as more hear about course benefits and opt to take the elective. Curricular changes to didactic courses and assessment processes have been implemented based on insights gained by faculty during the course.

Considerations for Programs Considering Similar Implementation

- 1. Create a classroom space that supports psychological safety is important to facilitate discussion and engagement among learners.
- 2. Consider if the course should be required or optional. Different offerings may be needed to create the wanted environment.
- 3. Consider the need for multiple sections of the course since learners at various academic levels or points in the curriculum can add a challenging element to creating relevant examples and assignments.
- 4. Avoid making assumptions that students are aware of different study methods or resources available to assist with learning material.
- 5. Understand that students are generally high achievers who are reluctant to ask for help as they associate it as a sign of weakness.
