Community Engagement

Saturday Clinic for the Uninsured (SCU):

- In 2022, SCU provided 833 medical visits to 267 uninsured patients of Milwaukee
 662 visits were made in person at our Ascension Family Health Center location
 171 visits were made via telehealth
- 355 volunteers (clinicians, pharmacy students, community volunteers)

Milwaukee Consortium for Hmong Health Conference:

- Dr. Lor was invited to be the keynote speaker for the conference and hosted the "Youth Dialogue: Getting into healthcare careers" panel
- over 200 community members participated in the event to obtain health screenings

MCW Neighborhood Partners Program

- Opioid Awareness, Naloxone Administration Training and Harm Reduction: 122 community members received training, 250+ fentanyl strip tests distributed
- Educational Panel Discussions (Topics include cervical health, heart health, poison center, men's health, pre- and post-natal health

- Vaccine Clinics True Love Outreach/Hayat: Six (6) vaccination clinics COVID-19, Influenza [approximately 50+ community members vaccinated], Next Door/Hayat: Two (2) vaccination clinics (COVID-19, Influenza, approximately 40 community members vaccinated).



Health Advancement for Asian American Pacific Islanders through Education (HAAPIE) Initiative

- MCWKnowledge Story on HAAPIE
- Curriculum: "purpose is to develop a health and cultural humility curriculum with a focus on Asian American, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander (AANHPI) populations. Highlight health issues through an integrative lens of historical trauma, intersectionality, structural competency and social determinants of health."

CONCLUSION

There were 12 events held for faculty, staff, and students with three ongoing community-engaged efforts that supported the three Elements of Inclusive Excellence. Of the 12 events, five were faculty development sessions on developing EDI in pharmacy research, one focused on wellness (which raised \$610 to support suicide awareness and prevention), three events focused on equity and diversity (celebrating women, refugees and invisible identities with Hmong communities) and three were networking/departmental events. There were three ongoing community engagement efforts — including the Saturday Clinic for the Uninsured (SCU), MCW Neighborhood Partners Program and Opioid Awareness Campaign, and Building a Culture of Health for Hmong communities. The Inclusive Excellence Framework served as a strong foundation on which to base EDI efforts supporting inclusive excellence at the MCW SOP for students, staff and faculty.
