Results


Canvas LMS

- Used for all PharmD courses
- Materials posted for students to prepare for class, including readings, videos, and other resources
- Classroom materials posted including Power Point slides, handouts, and others
- Use of Canvas quizzes is widespread throughout courses in curriculum
- Discussion Board frequently used to encourage questions and other assignments to be shared with other students enrolled to help in preparation for assessments

Panopto

- Software used to record flipped lectures posted in advance of class in Canvas
- Lectures in all required courses recorded and posted to Canvas to be used as study tool
- Simultaneous display of Power Point, closed captioning, and voice recording
- Includes quizzes to assess students learning within the recording

Poll Everywhere


- Audience-response software integrated into Power Point
- Allows for in-class assessments



Results

Exam Soft

- All high stakes exams administered through ExamSoft program
- Allows for tagging questions to PharmD Educational Competencies, Bloom's level of knowledge



COMP-MS

- All PharmD students maintain online portfolio to track progress towards PharmD Educational Competencies
- Students develop and reflect on educational and professional goals
- Assists in professional identity formation
- Allows for individualized advising opportunities
