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Reframe 106

- As a tool to improve and refine the project
- As a gap analysis opportunity

Success Starts With

- Authentic and transparent communication
- Active listening to understand interested party concerns

Identify Historic Resources Early

- Completed surveys inform critical conversations
- Propose relevant measures early to assist with Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) execution

Consult Interested Parties Often

- Discuss potential impacts and resolutions
- Develop project resiliency with buy-in

Section 106 helps <u>engage</u> interested parties and <u>build</u> <u>consensus</u> early.

Section 106 Is:

- A federally required review & consultation
- Concurrent with NEPA
- Concluded with an MOA, which is a legally binding agreement document that resolves project impacts
- Critical to reach approval to proceed with construction

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
